


PSHE Curriculum Impact Statement 2023



Overall synopsis / developments:

I have taken over the role of PSHE leader this year and intend to link this with my role as SENDCO.

I have worked with our deputy head to review our current scheme 'Jigsaw' and we have decided to use and adapt the Kapow scheme for PSHE/RSE. The scheme covers wider PSHE learning, in line with the requirement of the national curriculum (2014). Children's learning through this scheme will significantly contribute to their personal development. The scheme promotes the four fundamental British values of democracy, rule of law, respect and tolerance, and individual liberty. It also includes learning and resources for wellbeing.

I have liaised with our staff governor for PSHE, who is also our governor for SEND/pupil premium. We are fortunate that she brings a lot of expertise to the role, and has provided resources that our ELSA is able to use with children.

Subject leadership - CPD, Monitoring and books:

I have joined the PSHE association to be able to access further resources, guidance and CPD.

All classes, have displays in class linked to kindness and our school values. Reward systems are linked to displaying our school values, and children have opportunities to identify and reward each other.

PSHE books vary in the amount of work they show. However, much of our learning in PSHE is carried out verbally, across daily school life and in other areas of the curriculum. We are considering this year, other ways to record and evidence our learning e.g. floor books.

PSHE in the EYFS:

Personal, social and emotional development is a prime area of the early years' foundation stage. This is part of children's daily learning/experiences and has been explicitly taught following the jigsaw scheme, which will now change to Kapow, which again will allow for a whole school structure.
