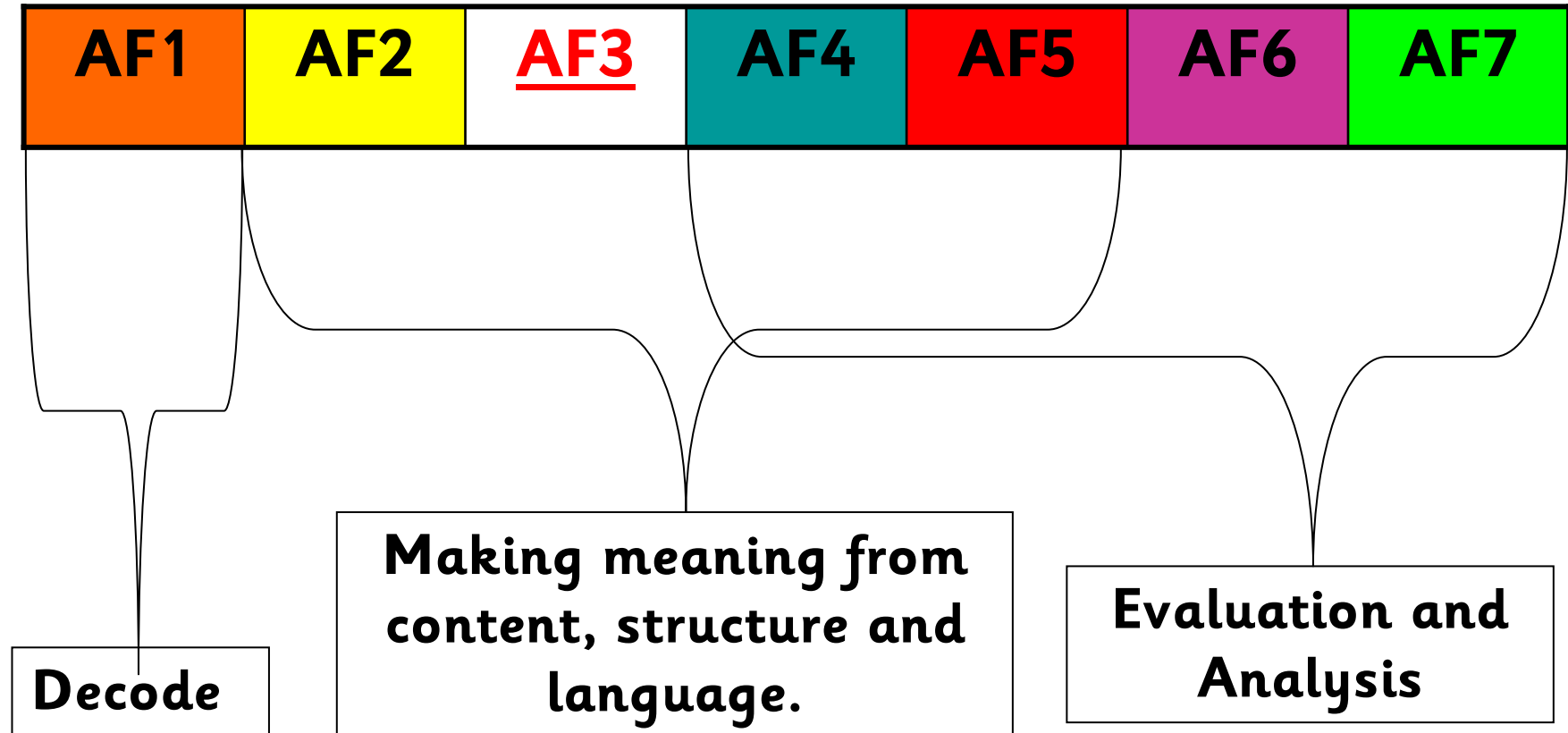

Making its purpose very clear.

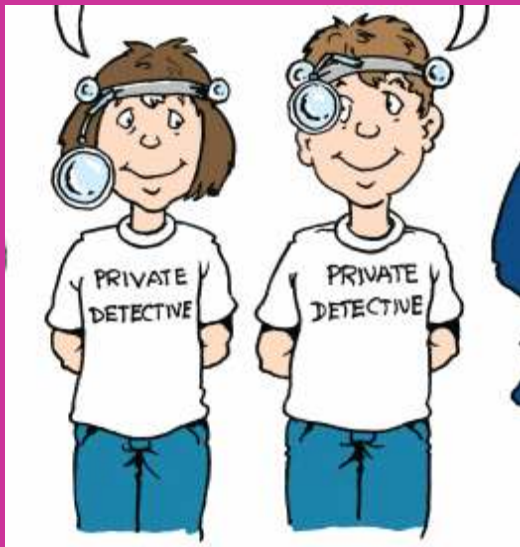
