Key Vocabulary:	
Monarchy	A monarchy is a type of government that has one person who runs it.
Monarch	The person who runs the monarchy. These are people such as a King or Queen. These people generally reign for life and then a son or daughter becomes the next monarch.
Reign	The time that someone rules.
Tudor	This period of time ran from Henry VII in 1485 until the death of Elizabeth I in 1603.
Henry VIII	Henry the 8 th was the king in the Tudor period and was well known for starting the church of England and for also having 6 wives!
Queen Elizabeth I	Elizabeth I was Queen of England, Ireland and Wales from 1558-1603.
Queen Victoria	Queen Victoria was the Queen from 1837-1901.

How were the Victorian and Tudor time periods different or similar?
